Destination Information

Nestled in the pristine heart of New Zealand's South Island, Te Rua-o-te-moko Fiordland beckons traveler's with its mystical magnetism.

Arriving in Invercargill, located at the southern tip of New Zealand's South Island, opens up the opportunity to explore the stunning Murihiku Southland region. The city of Invercargill, fondly dubbed the "City of Water and Light", referring to the long summer daylight hours, frequent appearances of the Aurora Australis (Southern Lights), and the city's position beside the Waihōpai River estuary. Invercargill boasts abundant charm and exudes a welcoming, relaxed atmosphere.

A Southland region is known for its natural beauty, rugged coastlines, and charming farmland. From Invercargill, you can embark on a scenic journey to explore the heartland of Southland and eventually make your way to Fiordland via enchanting coastlines and pastoral landscapes.

Choose Te Anau and Manapouri as your base camp to explore Fiordland National Park's timeless wilderness. With three of the Great Walks; The Kepler, The Milford and the Routeburn it is New Zealand's hiking capital. Portions of these Great Walks can be accessed as day walks. There are over 20 day walk options in the area, people can hike to their heart's content, summit a peak, dip in an alpine lake, then return to base for a hot shower and comfy lodgings.

Fiordland, with its coveted World Heritage Status, boasts thirteen magnificent fiords within the Fiordland National Park. Among these, Piopiotahi Milford Sound stands out as the most recognised New Zealand landscape. The journey to Milford Sound via the awe-inspiring alpine road, is hailed as one of the world's most exceptional drives.

For those seeking a pristine wilderness adventure, a visit to Patea Doubtful Sound offers a remarkable experience. Explorers are often treated to sightings of dolphins and a plethora of other marine creatures in this more remote locale.

Fiordland offers an array of activities that allow visitors to fully immerse themselves in its unique environment. These options include kayaking and cruising, scenic flights, exploring glowworm caves, jet boating and a visit to the distinctive Discovery Centre underwater observatory.

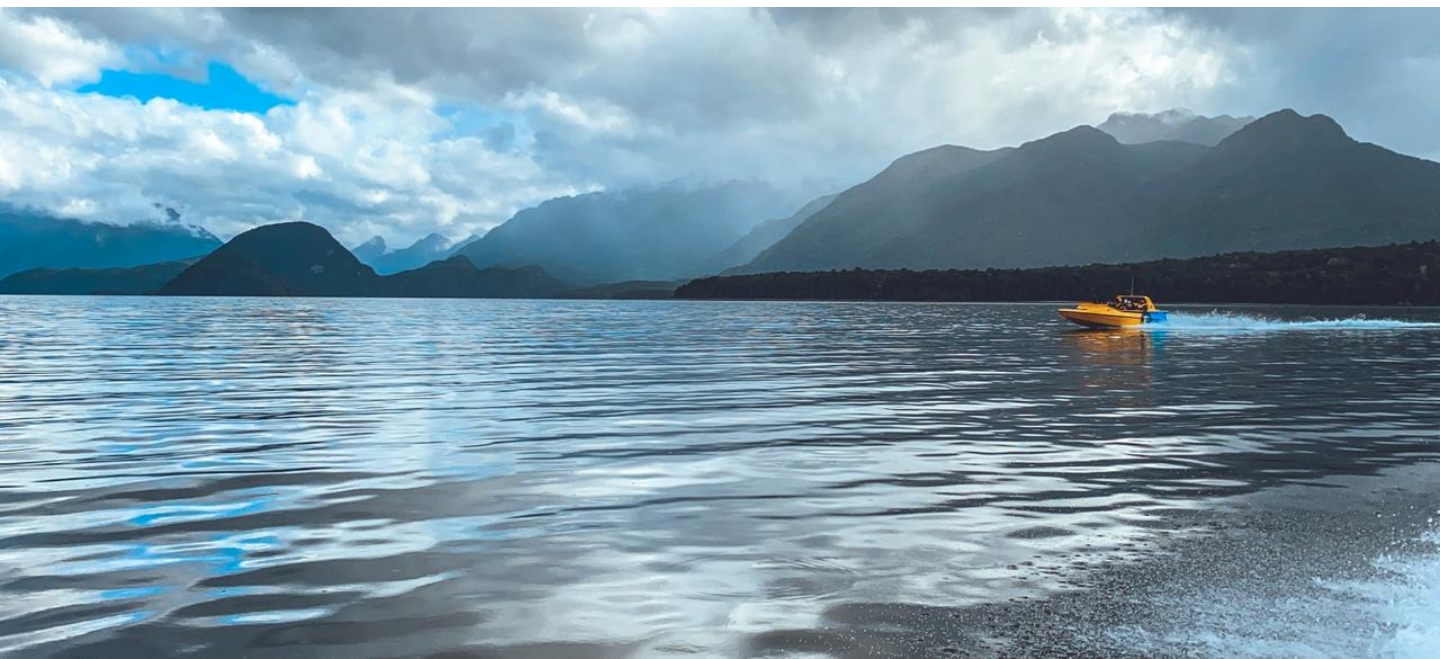
